

Ca.tter – Mine EP (DSQ-008)

» Back after a bit of a break, Dubsquare Records deploys another white label session from their Vienna Base.

Ca.tter is on duty this time around, treating us to three cuts of slow motion House spliced with precision sound design and intoxicating melodies.

‘Mine’ on the top side plucks a crystalline melody over scattershot percussion and fizzing atmospherics, slowly developing into a cantering rhythm laced with tribal drums, full of suspense and immaculately produced. Clocking in at nearly 12 minutes long it’s a heady trip, exploring spaces pioneered by the likes of Muslimgauze and furthered by Shackleton – get lost in this one. ‘Feels Like Sunday’ is the real gem here though, pounding kick drums slowed to a narcotic crawl pound underneath a woozy melody that’ll send you way off into outer space. Evolving steadily through the duration, this one takes numerous twists and turns, crafty edits and counter melody creep in and fade away, all the while underpinned by that pounding kick drum.

‘Gift’ is the final track and an apt title, this one sounds like a trance record played at the wrong speed and with the low pass filter left on the Pioneer, perhaps after a particularly heavy session. It’s simple and delightfully effective, melancholy yet hopeful – slo-mo euphoria.

Deadly at the right time in a dance and wicked on the home turntable as well.

Very highly recommended this one. «

» Unique rhythmic sequences for open minded dancers and skilled DJs – IZC twists our brains up with this no nonsense, hand stamped white label, released by the Vienna based Dubsquare Recordings label.

There are hints of 2-step, Funky and Perlon-esque minimal techno at work across both sides here, fractured beat patterns and syncopated percussion are the order of the day, perhaps best framed on the A2 cut ‘Red String Conspiracy’. Sounding like a collaboration between EL-B in his Ghost prime and Melchoir Productions it’s a lesson in minimal 2-step and icy atmospherics.

‘Ginger Sample’ on the B1 is pure sub pressure, skipping drums loosely harness sweeping 808 basses, a deadly tool for DJs and one that’ll have people leaning over the decks looking for a track title – thankfully its a white label... «

El Rakkas – Extremely Cheap And Effective EP (DSQ-004)

» Title track is minimal Austrian clicky business with sonar bleeps. Reminds me of The Psychick Warriors Ov Gaia, which is a very good thing. Then it goes fucking MENTAL when Raster Noton artist Pomassl busts is, turns everything up and starts attacking all the carefully crafted sounds with a cheese grater. "Done Already" has beats so abstract they sound like a mistake to begin with, but then your rave DNA tunes in and everything comes into focus. "Interference" is all night-driving lushness that would sound incredible at 5am through a proper system. Vinyl only. Respect. «

Right from the get go this 12? asserts itself as one for the eyes down crew as the title track barrels in with a barrage of sub low pressure and Techno influenced stabs. Reminiscent of early Pinch and Tectonic releases this track bridges the gap between classic Dubstep and the current wave of 130 Techno ruffige. Similarly the remix by, Laton head and Sex Tags affiliate, Pomassl reinterprets the title track with deadly efficacy, upping the energy, roughing up the main synth motif and introduces swathes of atmosphere perfect for the dance!

Back to El Rakkas with the EL-B and Groove Chronicles influence clearly shown on the track "Done Already" using a similar palette but this time with a bumpy UKG Flava! Heavy nods to Jungle as well.

With the closer "Interference" there is more of a Spherix or early Shackleton vibe to be found, as skittering hats and dark drones typify a track built solely for a dark room with a big rig! «
